Historical thinking, Wineburg shows us in Why Learn History (When It 's Already on Your Phone), has nothing to do with test prep – style ability to memorize facts. Instead, it 's an orientation to the world that we can cultivate, one that encourages reasoned skepticism, discourages haste, and counters our tendency to confirm our biases. Wineburg draws on surprising discoveries from an array of research and experiments—including surveys of students, recent attempts to update history curricula, and analyses of how historians, students, and even fact checkers approach online sources—to paint a picture of a dangerously mine-filled landscape, but one that, with care, attention, and awareness, we can all learn to navigate. It 's easy to look around at the public consequences of historical ignorance and despair. Wineburg is here to tell us it doesn 't have to be that way. The future of the past may rest on our screens. But its fate rests in our hands.
